

These postures are optional & *could* help you center your thoughts & bodies on worship. If you are confused or don't know what to do, don't worry about "getting it right." God welcomes your prayers. It matters not your posture to the Holy Trinity.

WHAT IS HOLY EUCHARIST?


Also called Holy Communion, the Divine Liturgy, the Great Offering, the Lord's Supper or Mass, is the sacrament commanded by Christ for the continual remembrance of his life, death, & resurrection, until his coming again. Because the Eucharist, the Church's sacrifice of praise & thanksgiving, is the way by which the sacrifice of Christ is made present, & in which he unites us to his one offering of himself, is also a remembrance of the meal of bread & wine Jesus shared with his disciples.

READINGS

FIRST READING

HOSEA 11:1-11

¹When Israel was a child, I loved him, & out of Egypt I called my son. ²The more I called them, the more they went from me; they kept sacrificing to the Baals, & offering incense to idols. ³Yet it was I who taught Ephraim to walk, I took them up in my arms; but they did not know that I healed them. ⁴I led them with cords of human kindness, with bands of love. I was to them like those who lift infants to their cheeks. I bent down to them & fed them. ⁵They shall return to the land of Egypt, & Assyria shall be their king, because they have refused to return to me. ⁶The sword rages in their cities, it consumes their oracle-priests, & devours because of their schemes. ⁷My people are bent on turning away from me. To the Most High they call, but he does not raise them up at all.

⁸How can I give you up, Ephraim? How can I hand you over, O Israel? How can I make you like Admah? How can I treat you like Zeboiim? My heart recoils within me; my compassion grows warm & tender. ⁹I will not execute my fierce anger; I will not again destroy Ephraim; for I am God & no mortal, the Holy One in your midst, & I will not come in wrath. ¹⁰They shall go after the Lord, who roars like a lion; when he roars, his children shall come trembling from the west. ¹¹They shall come trembling like birds from Egypt, & like doves from the land of Assyria; & I will return them to their homes, says the Lord.

COLOSSIANS 3:1-11

¹So if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. ²Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, ³for you have died, & your life is hidden with Christ in God. ⁴When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory.

⁵Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, & greed (which is idolatry). ⁶On account of these the wrath of God is coming on those who are disobedient. ⁷These are the ways you also once followed, when you were living that life.

⁸But now you must get rid of all such things—anger, wrath, malice, slander, & abusive language from your mouth. ⁹Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices¹⁰& have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. ¹¹In that renewal there is no longer Greek & Jew, circumcised & uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave & free; but Christ is all & in all!
